We hope all players and parents enjoy the football during the current season and participate with fellow players, Coaches and other parents in a family club environment.

Please take time to read the Code of Behaviour as it applies to all Players, Coaching Staff, Parents & Spectators. Take Note... If any of the codes below are broken and you are to face the Gold Coast District for a hearing, then you will be liable for the fines/fees and suspensions the District may impose for your misconduct.

Misconduct will not be tolerated within a Club or on Club Grounds.

1. Parents/Players/Spectators should adhere to all rules/by-laws/constitution in the spirit of the game. Never dispute a Referee's decision by word or gesture.
2. No swearing/sledging/abuse, by parents/spectators or players, will be tolerated on or off the field.
3. Parents/Players/Spectators should be good sports and encourage and support other team members. Please remember that league is an organised sport and is for the player's enjoyment.
4. Parents and players should work together and support and promote good sportsmanship.
5. Parents/Players/Spectators should show respect to Coaches, Managers, Officials and other players.
6. Respect should be given to other people's property and the Clubs property.
7. Parents/Players should seek permission from your Coach before leaving training sessions or leaving a game.
8. Parents/Players/Spectators should control their temper both on and off the fields including when you are on Club Property before, during and after training sessions or games.
9. Parents/Players/Spectators, please remember that Coaches are volunteers and let them do the training and value their knowledge and the time they give to the players. Coaches should be shown respect and, if it is necessary to discipline a player, the Coach will abide by the Club's rules. Parents are expected to avoid coaching from the sideline as this confuses players.
10. Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not harassing players, Referees, Coaches and Officials.
11. Alcohol may only be consumed in designated areas, during training sessions or game days. This includes away games, as all liquor licensed Clubs in the GC District have designated areas.
12. No drugs are allowed or are to be taken on or off the field or in the Club leased area.
13. Players should play for the fun of it and not just to please parents and Coaches.

I understand and accept the above rules and agree to abide by the Code of Behaviour both on and off the field. I understand I am signing this agreement on behalf of all family members who may accompany me at games/training. I agree to ensure all family members who accompany me at games/training understand & abide by this Code of Behaviour.

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There are three levels of misconduct if any codes are broken.

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| 1 st Offence | <i>The player/parent will be warned by the Coach/Executive concerning his behaviour and that it will not be tolerated. (Verbal warning)</i> |
| 2 nd Offence | <i>A letter will be sent about the consistent bad behaviour of the player/parent and suspension of one game may be given. (Written warning)</i> |
| 3 rd Offence | <i>A letter will be sent to the parent/player/spectator asking to show cause why they should not be deregistered and suspended for the Season. (Meet with the committee/judiciary)</i> |

NB: Should the offence be considered severe behaviour (behaviour thus endangering others physically or emotionally) the Club Executive Committee reserve the right to issue an immediate suspension to the offender.
